Dear Families,

At AIS we have a BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) program that **requires only the use of an Apple iPad**. Technology in classes is driven by learning and agreed upon by the teacher and students. Please keep in mind a Bring Your Own Device environment promotes a heathy use of technology; all student devices should have the same capacity. When students share the same kind of device, teachers are able to assist students with different programs and remediate any issues that arise very quickly.

Internet Access and Setup	
Internet access is important as it will allow your child to share work with their teacher, classmates, families, do research, and more.

Software and Passwords	
Seesaw is the main app for learning journals and communicating student learning home.	
Your child will also be learning with a variety of apps. A comprehensive list of apps to download will be sent from your child's teacher at the beginning of the year. It is highly recommended that your child has QR Reader installed on their iPad if the iPad camera does not read QR codes. In addition, multiple browsers are recommended, e.g., Safari, Chrome, Firefox.
